

Hennick Centre Collaborative Research Fund December 2010

Proposal

The Hennick Centre Collaborative Research Fund is dedicated to joint business, law, and public policy scholarship, by engaging faculty at each of Osgoode Hall Law School and the Schulich School of Business.

The Hennick Centre Collaborative Research Fund announces its grant program for the 2010/2011 academic year. Awards will be up to \$5000 per research initiative to full-time faculty members of either the Schulich School of Business or Osgoode Hall Law School, who undertake collaborative research activities with full-time faculty members of the other school, as described below. All eligible requests, based on these criteria, will be considered; the number of awards will be subject to availability of funds.

Qualifying Opportunities

In order to qualify for a grant, the collaborative research activity must meet the following criteria:

1. The research project must include at least one (1) member of the faculty of Osgoode Hall Law School, and at least one (1) member of the faculty of the Schulich School of Business. (Applications are welcome from full-time and/or part-time faculty members of both schools.) In addition to the required faculty members from Osgoode and Schulich, teams may include faculty members from other departments at York University as well as graduate students.
2. The activity should develop or enhance the research or scholarship of the participating faculty members and may include regular group meetings, presentations, seminars, funding for student co-ordinators or administrative support.
3. The research activity may be a specific “one-time” event or may be an ongoing event.
4. The grants will not ordinarily be awarded to research activity that has already received funding from another source, unless the results of the collaborative research activity can be used as the basis for new funding opportunities.

5. Within three (3) months following the conclusion of the research activity, the faculty recipients of the grant must provide a 1-3 page report to the Director of the Hennick Centre for Business and Law on the activities undertaken and the results achieved.

Application Procedures

Interested applicants must send a brief statement detailing their collaborative research activity proposal, along with a proposed budget, to Hennick Centre Assistant Director Elizabeth Saati (contact details below) by no later than **the deadline of February 28, 2011**. Applications must be co-signed by the relevant Schulich and Osgoode faculty members.

Grants will be awarded by the Hennick Centre for Business and Law after review by the Directors of the Hennick Centre, and the appropriate committee.
